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## INSTRUCTIONS HOW TO FILL OUT CERTIFICATE OF ORIGIN ISRAEL- KOREA

The instructions below apply to both electronic and paper Certificates of Origin.

### Box No. 1 – “Exporter”

This box shall bear the details of of the exporter, its name and its address in the exporting country.

### Box No. 2 – “Certificate No.”

This box is for the use of the exporting country, which shall fill in the certificate number.

### Box No. 3 – “Importer”

This box shall bear the details of the importer of the goods in the country of final destination. If, for commercial reasons it is not possible to designate the importer, the exporter shall complete the box with “Unknown”.

### Box No. 4 – "Country of Origin"

This box shall bear the name of the country where the goods in question obtained their originating status.

### Box No. 5 – “Port of shipment and Transport Details” (Optional)

This box shall indicate the port of shipment from Korea or from Israel.

### Box No. 6 – “Country of Destination”

This box shall bear the name of the country which is the final destination of the goods.

### Box No. 7 – “Observations”

This box shall bear observations made by the country of exportation, for example, the mention “DUPLICATE”, “ISSUED RETROSPECTIVELY”, “OUTWARD PROCESSING”, information on production areas (location & postal code<sup>1</sup>).

### Box No. 8 – “Commercial Invoices”

This box shall bear the number of the invoices that are covered by the certificate. If, for commercial reasons it is not possible to designate the number of the invoice, the exporter shall complete the box with “Unknown”.

### Box No. 9 – “Description of the goods”

This box shall bear a detailed description of all the goods covered by the certificate. The description of goods must be sufficiently detailed to enable the goods to be identified by the Customs Officers examining them as much as possible.

In the field named “No.”, the row number of the goods (index) will be written.

In the field named "Tariff item number" – the HS Code shall be filled at the 6 digit level.

For goods that meet the origin criteria, the exporter and/or producer must indicate the origin criteria met, in the manner shown in the following table:

(a) The goods wholly obtained or produced in a Party within the meaning of Article 3.3.	“WO”
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<sup>1</sup> The location (including postal code) where the production conferring origination status has taken place.

(b)	The goods obtained in a Party incorporating materials which have not been wholly obtained there, provided that such materials have undergone sufficient working or processing in a Party within the meaning of Article 3.4.	“PSR”
(c)	The goods obtained in a Party exclusively from materials that qualify as originating pursuant to Chapter on Rules of Origin	“PE”
(d)	The goods are produced in outward processing zones as agreed on the basis of Annex 3-B (COMMITTEE ON OUTWARD PROCESSING ZONES ON THE KOREAN PENINSULA)	“OP”

Lack of correspondence between the origin criterion detailed on the certificate and the actual origin criterion shall not in itself constitute a reason for voiding the certificate.

In the field reserved for the gross weight or other quantity – the gross weight or any other units of quantity of the goods shall be detailed.

\* Lack of correspondence between the HS Code detailed on the certificate and the actual classification by the competent authority of the importing country, shall not in itself constitute a reason for voiding the certificate.

**Box No. 10 – “Declaration by the Exporter”**

The exporter shall indicate in the proper field whether or not he is the producer. If the exporter is also the producer of the goods covered by the certificate, he shall mark the box “Producer”. If not, he shall mark the box “Exporter”.

**Box No. 11 – “Certification”**

This box shall bear the details of the certifying authority, and shall be signed and stamped by that authority.
